In 2000 Steve and Angela Rowley visited their friend Ayugi and his family in Nyandiwa, W Kenya. They soon discovered the greatest need in this, the poorest area of Kenya, was clean drinking water. In 2001 they returned to Nyandiwa to establish a bio-sand water filter project. The workshop is self-sustaining and has already sold 700+ filters in the community and beyond. People are keen to report that their families no longer contract typhoid, dysentery, cholera, diarrhoea or other water-borne diseases. Five more workshops some distance away have been set up and others are planned.

Nyandiwa already had an established primary school for which we have built three new classrooms and begun replacement of the remaining eight thanks mainly to donations from The Kingsway School, Cheadle. A Secondary School with four forms (roughly ages 15-18) was founded in 2004 and the first cohort took leaving examinations last November. The first 10% of every student's fees is paid and some 30% of students, mainly orphans living with relatives locally, are fully sponsored. Every student is bought a school uniform at the beginning of Form 1 and Form 3, examination fees are paid and equipment is purchased. The school has five classrooms, staffroom and science laboratory and a community library is being built. Solar panels will be installed to provide much-needed light in the evening when some students stay to study.

In 2005 a dispensary with resident health practitioner and nurses was opened. Until its establishment, the nearest dispensary was a 24 km walk away and the nearest hospital 70 km. Nyandiwa dispensary is open for consultations all day, has two bedrooms for overnight stays and has seen many babies delivered with a dramatic fall in infant mortality. Two more wards have been built, each containing six beds, which will allow the dispensary to function as an AIDS Counselling and Treatment Centre and Family Planning Clinic.

A small house has been built on Ayugi's compound to provide accommodation for visitors and short-term workers.

The projects are transforming a whole community thanks to donations from many varied sources. In the last few years special gifts have provided uniforms, equipment and desks, fees, medicines, filters, mosquito nets and vaccinations for 2,750 children. Every little does really help.
